



Second Reading: Romans 12:9-21

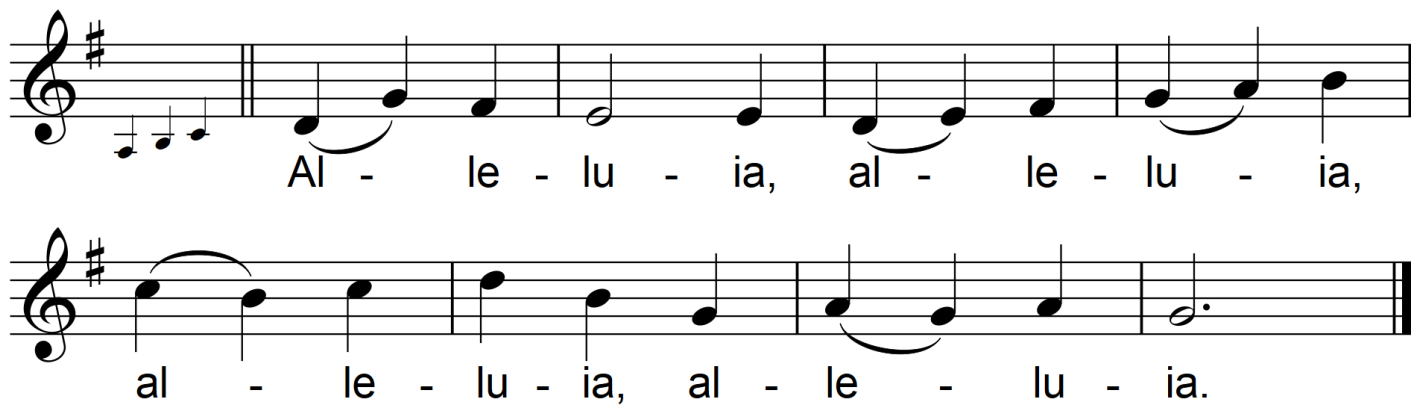

Lift up your hearts.

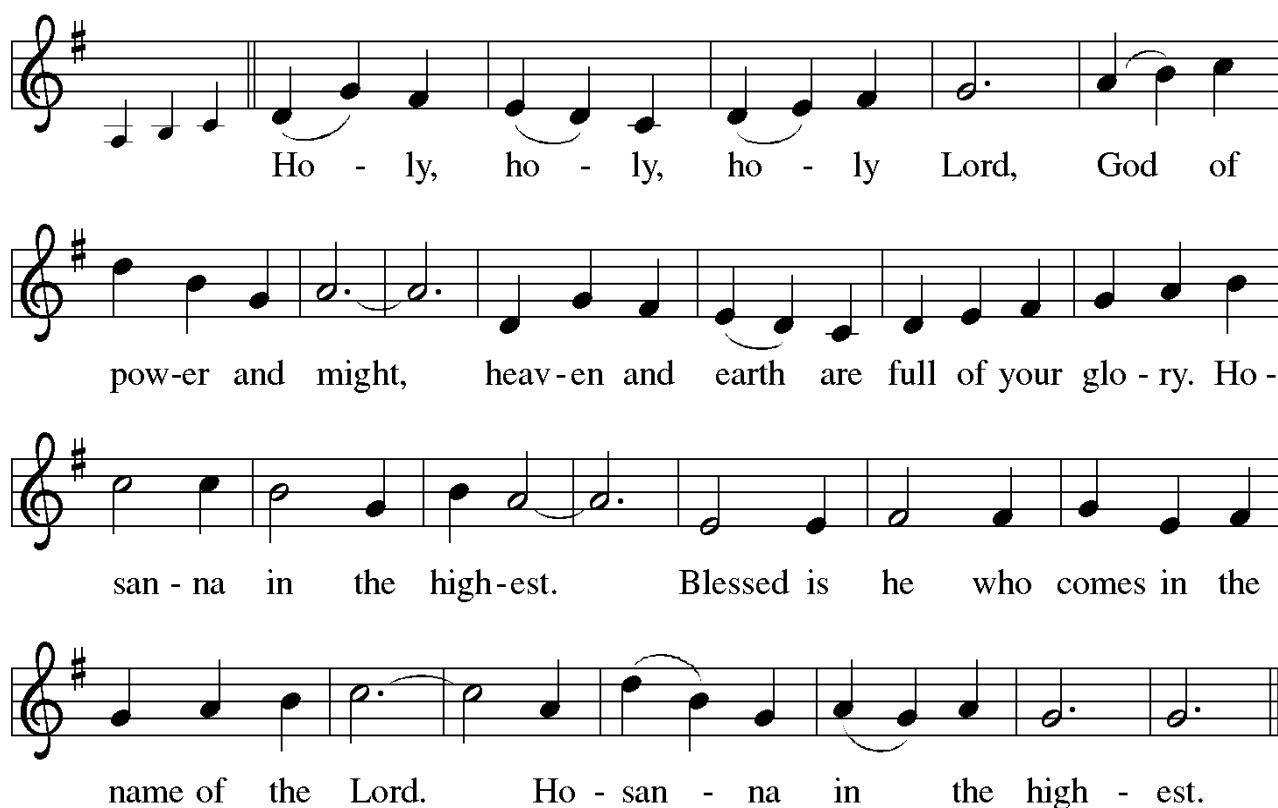
We lift them to the Lord.

today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive**


