THE DIALOGUE AND BLESSING OF PALMS

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. **Hosanna to the Son of David.**

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

We praise and thank you, O God ... one God, now and forever. **Amen.**

1. <u>THE ENTRY INTO JERUSALEM - THE PALM SUNDAY</u> <u>PROCESSION</u>

<u>Narrator</u>: When Jesus drew near to Bethphage and Bethany, at the mount that is called Olivet, he sent ahead two of his disciples, saying,

<u>Jesus</u>: "Go into the village opposite. There you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever yet sat; untie it and bring it here. If any one

asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' you shall say, 'The Lord has need of it.'"

<u>Narrator</u>: So those who were sent went away and found it as he had told them and as they were untying the colt, its owners said to them,

All: "Why are you untying the colt?"

Peter: "The Lord has need of it."

<u>Narrator</u>: And they brought it to Jesus, and throwing their garments on the colt, they set Jesus upon it. And as he rode along, they spread their garments on the road. As he was now drawing near, at the descent of the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to rejoice and to praise God with a loud voice for all the mighty works that they had seen, saying:

People: (singing, while moving into the sanctuary) Hymn #344

Refrain: All glory, laud, and honor to you, redeemer, king, to whom the lips of children made sweet hosannas ring.

You are the king of Israel and David's royal Son, now in the Lord's name coming, our King and Blessed One. *Refrain*

The company of angels are praising you on high; Creation and all mortals in chorus make reply. *Refrain*

The multitude of pilgrims with palms before you went; our praise and prayer and anthems before you we present. *Refrain*

Narrator: And some of the Pharisees in the multitude cried to him,

<u>All</u>: "Teacher, rebuke your disciples! They're calling you the Christ. Tell them to shut up!"

<u>Jesus</u>: "I tell you, if these were silent the very stones themselves would cry out."

All: (singing)

To you, before your passion, they sang their hymns of praise. To you, now high exalted, our melody we raise. *Refrain*

Their praises you accepted; accept the prayers we bring, great author of all goodness, O good and gracious King. *Refrain*

(Sit)

Narrator: And when he drew near and saw the city he wept over it.

<u>Jesus</u>: "Would that even today you knew the things that make for peace! But now they are hid from your eyes. O Jerusalem! The days shall come upon you, when your enemies will cast up a bank about you and surround you, and hem you in on every side, and dash you to the ground, you and your children within you, and they will not leave one stone upon another in you; because you did not know the time of your visitation."

2. <u>THE PREPARATION AND THE EATING OF THE LAST SUPPER –</u> THE PASSION OF OUR LORD

<u>Narrator</u>: Now, the feast of Unleavened Bread drew near, which is called the Passover. And the temple priests were seeking how to put Jesus to death; for they feared the people. Then Satan entered into Judas called Iscariot, who was of the number of the twelve; he went away and conferred with the temple priests and officers how he might betray him to them. And they were glad, and engaged to give him money. So he agreed, and sought an opportunity to betray him to them in the absence of the multitude. Then came the day of Unleavened Bread, on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. So Jesus sent Peter and John, saying,

Jesus: "Go and prepare the Passover for us, that we may eat it."

<u>All</u>: "But where, Lord? Where will you have us prepare it, and what are we to do?"

Jesus: "Behold, when you have entered the city, a man carrying a jar

of water will meet you; follow him into the house which he enters, and tell the householder, 'The Teacher says to you, Where is the guest room, where I am to eat the Passover with my disciples?' And he will show you a large upper room furnished; there make ready."

- <u>Narrator</u>: And they went and found it as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover. And when the hour came, he sat at table, and the apostles with him. And he said to them,
- <u>Jesus</u>: "I have earnestly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. For I tell you, I shall not eat it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God."

Narrator: And he took the cup, and when he had given thanks he said,

- <u>Jesus</u>: "Take this and divide it among yourselves; for I tell you that from now on I shall not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes."
- <u>Narrator</u>: And he took bread and when he had given thanks he broke it and gave it to them, saying,
- <u>Jesus</u>: "This is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."
- Narrator: And likewise the cup after supper, saying,
- <u>Jesus</u>: "This cup which is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood. But behold the hand of him who betrays me is with me on the table. For the Son of Man goes as it has been determined: but woe to that man by whom he is betrayed!"
- Narrator: And they began to question,

<u>All</u>: "Who, Lord? Who is to betray you? Is it I? Is it I?"

- <u>Jesus</u>: "He who has dipped his hand in the dish with me will betray me. Oh, it would have been better for that man if he had not been born."
- Narrator: Judas, who betrayed him, said,

Judas: "Is it I, Master?"

Jesus: "You have said so."

Narrator: Simon Peter was indignant.

Peter: "But not I! Though they all fall away from you, I will never leave you."

<u>Jesus</u>: "Peter, truly I say to you, this very night, before the cock crows, you will deny me three times."

Peter: "Even if I must die with you, I will never deny you!"

All: And so said all of the disciples, over and over again.

3. THE AGONY IN THE GARDEN

<u>All</u>: (singing)

Go to dark Gethsemane, all who feel the tempter's pow'r; your Redeemer's conflict see. Watch with him one bitter hour; turn not from his griefs away; learn from Jesus Christ to pray.

<u>Narrator</u>: And he came out and went, as was his custom, to the Mount of Olives, and the disciples followed him. And when he came to the place he said to them,

<u>Jesus</u>: "Pray that you may not enter into temptation."

All: Save us from the time of trial, and deliver us, deliver us.

<u>Narrator</u>: And he withdrew from them about a stone's throw, and knelt down and prayed,

<u>Jesus</u>: "Father, if thou art willing, remove this cup from me; nevertheless, not my will, but thine be done."

All: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come: your will be done. Your will be done. Your will be done –

<u>Narrator</u>: And when he rose from prayer, he came to the disciples and found them sleeping for sorrow,

- <u>Jesus</u>: "Why do you sleep? Rise and pray that you may not enter into temptation."
- <u>All</u>: Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil, even the evil within ourselves.
- <u>Narrator</u>: While he was still speaking, there came a crowd, and the man called Judas, one of the twelve, was leading them. He drew near to Jesus to kiss him.

Jesus: "Judas, would you betray the Son of Man with a kiss?"

Judas: "Hail, Master."

Narrator: When the disciples saw what would follow, they said,

All: "Lord, shall we strike with the sword?"

<u>Narrator</u>: And one of them struck the slave of the high priest and cut off his right ear. But Jesus said,

Jesus: "No more of this!"

Narrator: And he touched his ear and healed him.

<u>All</u>: Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.

Narrator: Jesus said to those who had come out against him,

<u>Jesus</u>: "When I was with you day after day in the temple, you did not lay hands on me. But this is your hour and the power of darkness." <u>Narrator</u>: Then they seized him –

4. THE JUDGMENT

All: (singing)

Follow to the judgment hall, view the Lord of life arraigned; oh, the wormwood and the gall! Oh, the pangs his soul sustained! Shun not suff'ring, shame, or loss; learn from him to bear the cross. <u>Narrator</u>: Then they seized him and led him away, bringing him to the High Priest's house. Peter followed at a distance; and when they had kindled a fire in the middle of the courtyard and sat down together, Peter sat among them. Then a maid, seeing him sit in the light, said,

Women: "This man also was with him."

Peter: "Woman, I do not know him."

Narrator: And a little later someone else saw him and said,

Men: "You also are one of them."

Peter: "I am not."

Narrator: An hour later another insisted, saying,

All: "Certainly this man also was with him: for he is a Galilean."

Peter: "I do not know what you are saying!"

<u>Narrator</u>: And immediately, while he was still speaking, the cock crowed. And the Lord turned and looked at Peter. And Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said to him,

<u>Jesus</u>: "Before the cock crows today, you will deny me three times."

<u>Narrator</u>: And he went out and he wept bitterly. Now the men who were holding Jesus mocked him and beat him; they blindfolded him and demanded:

<u>All</u>: "Prophesy! Who is it that struck you?"

<u>Narrator</u>: And they spoke many other words against him, reviling him. When the day came, the assembly of the elders of the people gathered together and led him to their council; and they said,

All: "If you are the Christ, tell us."

<u>Jesus</u>: "If I tell you, you will not believe; and if I ask you now, you will not answer. But from now on the Son of man shall be seated at the right hand of the power of God –"

All: "Are you the Son of God, then?"

Jesus: "You say that I am."

<u>All</u>: "Blasphemy! What further testimony do we need? We have heard it ourselves from his own lips. Blasphemy! Oh, <u>blasphemy!</u>"

5. DAWN FRIDAY: JESUS BEFORE PILATE

<u>Narrator</u>: Then the whole company of them arose, and brought him before Pontius Pilate and they began to curse him, saying,

<u>All</u>: "We found this man perverting our nation, and forbidding us to give tribute to Caesar, and saying that he himself is Christ the King!"

Narrator: And Pilate asked him,

Pilate: "Are you the King of the Jews?"

Jesus: "You have said so."

Narrator: And Pilate said to the Chief Priests and the multitudes,

Pilate: "I find no crime in this man."

Narrator: But they were urgent, saying,

<u>All</u>: "He stirs up the people, teaching throughout Galilee even to this place."

- <u>Narrator</u>: And when Pilate heard that he was a Galilean, of Herod's jurisdiction, he sent him to Herod, where he was vehemently accused, and treated with contempt and mocked, and arrayed in gorgeous purple, and then sent back again. Pilate said to the rulers of the people,
- <u>Pilate</u>: "You brought me this man as one who was perverting the people; and after examining him, behold, I did not find him guilty of any of the charges against him. Behold, *nothing* deserving death has been done by him. I will therefore chastise him and release him

<u>All</u>: "Away with this man! Away! Away! Release to us Barabbas –"

<u>Pilate</u>: "Barabbas! – a man who has been thrown into prison for insurrection and for murder – surely you would rather release Jesus."

All: "Crucify him! Crucify him!"

<u>Pilate</u>: "Why? What evil has he done? I've found no crime in him deserving death. I'll chastise him. I'll release him –"

All: "Crucify him! Crucify him!"

<u>Narrator</u>: And their voices prevailed. So Pilate gave sentence that their demand should be granted. He released the man who had been jailed for murder. But Jesus he delivered up to their will.

6. FRIDAY MORNING: CRUCIFIXION

All: (singing)

_"

Calvary's mournful mountain climb; there, adoring at his feet, mark that miracle of time, God's own sacrifice complete. "It is finished!" hear him cry; learn from Jesus Christ to die.

- <u>Narrator</u>: And as they led him away, they seized one Simon of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, and laid on him the cross, to carry it behind Jesus. And there followed him a great multitude of women who bewailed and lamented him – But Jesus turning to them said,
- <u>Jesus</u>: "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but weep for yourselves and for your children. For behold, the days are coming when they will say, 'Blessed are the barren, and the wombs that never bore, and the breasts that never gave suck!' For if they do this when the wood is green, what will happen when it dries!"

Solo: "Were You There?"

Narrator: Two others also, who were criminals, were led away to be

put to death with him. And when they came to the place which is called the Skull, there they crucified him, and the criminals, one on the right and one on the left.

All: (singing)

Were you there when they nailed him to the tree? Were you

there when they nailed him to a tree? Oh, sometimes it causes

me to tremble, tremble, tremble. Were you there when they

nailed him to the tree?

Jesus: "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."

<u>Women</u>: Forgive us our sins.

Men: "Let us cast lots to divide his garments."

<u>Women</u>: Forgive us our sins.

- <u>Narrator</u>: And the people stood by, watching, but the rulers scoffed at him, saying,
- Men: "He saved others: let him save himself, if he is the Christ of God!"

Women: Forgive us our sins.

<u>Narrator</u>: The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him vinegar. There was an inscription over him that read:

Women: "This is the king of the Jews."

<u>Men</u>: Forgive us our sins. Forgive us, O Lord, our sins!

<u>Narrator</u>: One of the two criminals who were hanged with him railed at him, saying,

1st Criminal: "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us!"

Narrator: But the other rebuked him, saying,

2nd Criminal: "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same

sentence, and we justly? But this man has done nothing wrong. Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

<u>All</u>: Forgive us our sins, deliver us from evil. For the kingdom is yours-

Narrator: And Jesus said to him -

All: The power is yours-

<u>Jesus</u>: "Truly, truly, I say to you-"

All: And the glory is yours-

Jesus: "Today you will be with me in Paradise."

All: Now and forever. Amen!

All: (singing)

Were you there when they pierced him in the side?

<u>Narrator</u>: It was now about the sixth hour – and there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour, while the sun's light failed ... And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from the top to the bottom ...

Jesus: "Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit!"

<u>Narrator</u>: And having said this, he breathed his last. All the multitudes who had assembled to see the sight when they saw what had taken place, returned home beating their breasts. And all his acquaintances and the women who had followed him from Galilee stood at a distance and saw these things –

7. LATE FRIDAY AFTERNOON: BURIAL

All: (singing)

Were you there when they laid him in the tomb? Were you there when they laid him in the tomb? Oh, sometimes it causes me to tremble, tremble, tremble. Were you there when they laid him in the tomb?

<u>Joseph:</u> Now there was a man named Joseph from the town of Arimathea, a righteous man, one looking for the kingdom of God. This man went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then he took it down and wrapped it in a linen shroud, and laid him in a rockhewn tomb, where no one had ever yet been laid. <u>Narrator:</u> It was the day of Preparation, and the Sabbath was beginning. The women who had come with him from Galilee followed, and saw the tomb and how his body was laid. Then they returned, and prepared spices and ointments. On the Sabbath they rest commandment.

(The congregation remains seated for a time of silent meditation.)

Nicene Creed



with sun and moon and stars,


we praise you, O God, blessed and holy Trinity, now and forever. **Amen.**
