

















Prayer of the Day

First Reading Acts 1:15-17, 21-26

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred twenty persons) and said, "Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus—for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry." So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from usone of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection." 
I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life.

We lift them to the Lord.


Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Invitation to Communion


The risen Christ is made known to us in the breaking of the bread.
